# *Progress with a Purpose*

**W**hen we established this foundation our intent was to provide the “Margin of Excellence” for the educational programs at the College. I am pleased to report that in just three short years we have met, and in some cases, exceeded our initial expectations. But we’re just getting started.

For nearly a year before we incorporated this foundation, we performed our due diligence by visiting the other staff college foundations, analyzing their founding documents and assessing their best practices and lessons learned. We crafted a hybrid model for our foundation with an entrepreneurial business focus that has served us well. We broke some “rules” by creating a large governing body when were advised to keep our Board small and manageable. So, we have a very large board with representatives from all over the country and made it manageable—our reach is impressive. Additionally, we benchmarked ourselves against the foundations providing support to the Air, Naval and Marine staff colleges borrowing the best they had to offer. As the new kid on the block we had a lot of ground to cover to catch up to our more established brethren.

At the end of our third year (2008) we have an impressive story to tell in terms of money received, programs supported, and investments established to ensure our future.

We have a small, engaged and highly-effective executive committee that helps provide direction between board meetings and a large, active and engaged Board of Trustees. Our board established early-on the principle that all trustees must remain engaged by making a personal commitment of financial support

and they also must support fund-raising. This has made the difference in our ability to reach our goals. During the recent economic downturn (in 2008) when the Dow Jones Industrial Average (DJIA) plunged 37 percent, our contributions soared 230 percent. This can only be explained by dedication, persistence and focus by our officers, trustees and staff. Where others lost money in the market, we did not have money in the market until very late in 2008. Consequently, we are buying in conservatively, at the bottom, or near bottom, of the market and have created an experienced investment committee to provide strategic guidance to our investment firm, Country Club Trust Company of Mission Hills, Kansas.

The financial information in this annual report reflects steady and consistent growth that has resulted in more programs and activities provided to the College and an increased level of savings for the future. The major programs started in 2008 include the Colin Powell lecture Series, the National Security Roundtable program and the establishment of the Alumni Outreach website. We have new and exciting programs in progress for the remainder of 2009 that will be reported in the October 2009 Foundation news magazine.

In sum, none of what we have accomplished to date would be achievable without the splendid support provided by companies, alumni, staff, faculty, and friends of the college. Together you have made the CGSC Foundation a creative and viable source of support for the future generations of officers who are educated at the Command a General Staff College. On behalf of the trustees and the College, I thank you.

## Enriching the College's academic environment

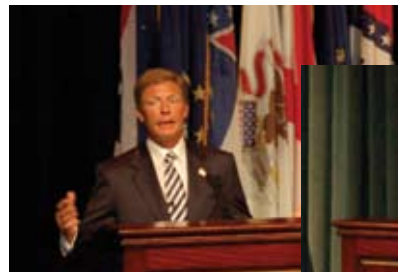
The Foundation has assisted the College in establishing a **lecture series** in the name of **Colin L. Powell**.

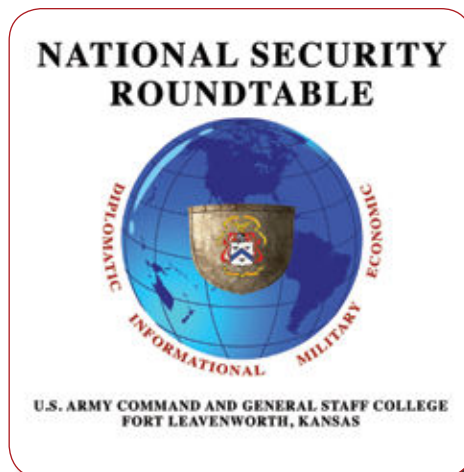

The CGSC Foundation has played a key role in establishing and administering the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College National Security Roundtable Series program--a program that is already lauded as one of the best outreach mechanisms for the College.

The CGSC Foundation has worked diligently with the Kansas City Public Library to bring CGSC participation into the library's Special Events program. In recent months, the Foundation sponsored two events in the series: one led by CGSC Deputy Commandant Brig. Gen. Ed Cardon about the current war's impact on leader development and education and a second presentation by historians from CGSC's Department of Military History on President Lincoln's leadership traits as commander-in-chief.



The CGSC Foundation is fortunate to have members of the board of trustees with diverse backgrounds and circles of influence. Last year, Ed Rensi, Foundation Trustee and owner of the Number 25 NASCAR Nationwide Series car, allowed the Foundation to get the 180 mph treatment at the Kansas Speedway for a nationally-televised race. The sponsor recognition potentially garnered thousands of impressions about the Foundation and the College.

To honor the rich heritage and contributions to our nation of the United States Army Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, the CGSC Foundation seeks to mint a congressionally-approved commemorative coin. Proceeds from the sale of the coins will not only help the CGSC Foundation fund programs and promote excellence in the faculty and students of CGSC, but also help increase the visibility of the significance of CGSC in our nation's history and in it's future.

## Promoting leader development



The CGSC Foundation sponsored the attendance of several CGSC faculty and students to an International Relations Council event in Kansas City to hear a presentation by the current Russian Ambassador to the United States.



The CGSC Foundation sponsored a visit to CGSC by renowned Counterinsurgency and Counterintelligence expert Col. (Ret.) Stuart Herrington. During his visit Herrington addressed a group of students who are intelligence officers, addressed a faculty luncheon meeting, and met with a student who is working on his master's degree on intel operations in the Vietnam War era.



The CGSC Foundation assisted the College in sending seven Command and General Staff School (CGSS) instructors to the Harvard Business School (HBS) "Art and Craft of Discussion Leadership" course.

The CGSC Foundation developed a program with DACOR (Diplomatic and Consular Officers, Retired) to sponsor a series of lectures on foreign policy and diplomacy for the CGSC. ## Encouraging excellence in the faculty and students

The CGSC Foundation sponsors several awards for each graduating class that recognize and encourage excellence in the faculty and students. The CGSC Foundation also participates in recognizing newly inducted members into the Fort Leavenworth International Hall of Fame.



## Maintaining contact with alumni

The CGSC Foundation publishes the CGSC **Foundation News** twice annually to report news about the College and the activities and programs supported by the Foundation. It also serves to connect with the alumni and to educate the civilian community and other constituencies.



The CGSC Foundation also **hosts the CGSC Alumni Outreach web site**-- A site for alumni of all the schools in CGSC (CGSS, SAMS, CAS3). Thousands of military officers, both U.S. and international, who have attended the Command and General Staff College now have a means of maintaining or regaining contact with their former classmates through this new web site. 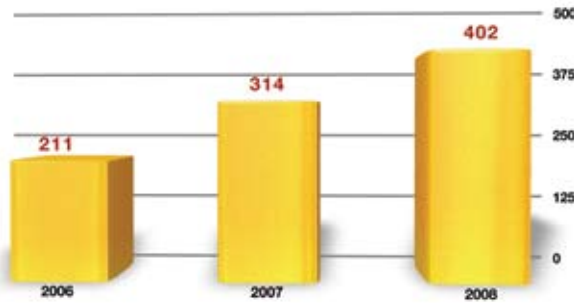

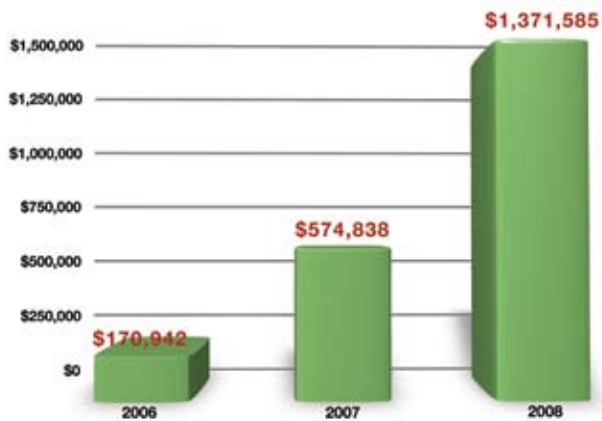

## Number of Donors



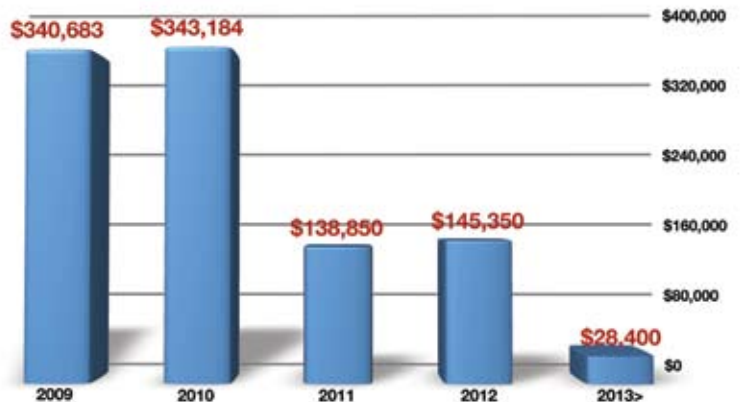
## Total Public Support

Cash, pledges & gross receipts from business operations

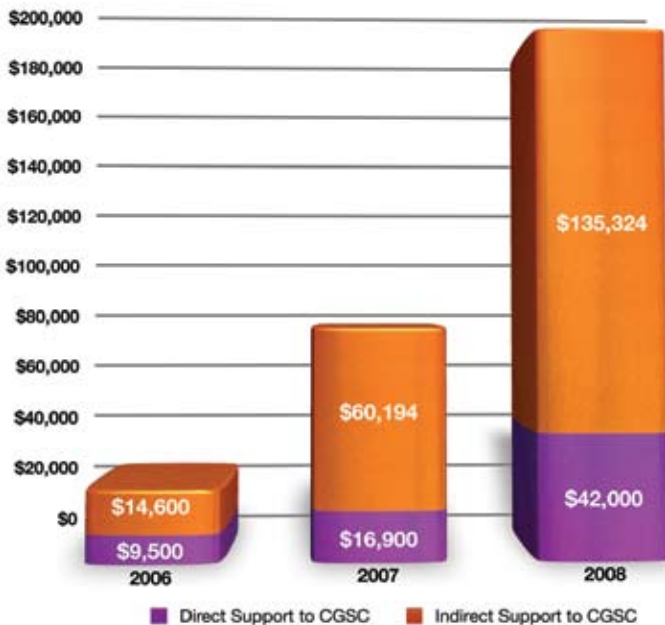


## Pledges Outstanding
