This first presentation in the new General of the Army George C. Marshall Military History Brown-Bag Lecture Series examines the key political-ideological, diplomatic and military aspects of the civil war in China from the Shanghai Massacre in 1927 to Mao Zedong's announcement of the establishment of the People's Republic of China in October 1949. This event presaged America's involvement in two Asia land wars over the next 25 years.



Dr. Joseph G.D. (Geoff) Babb is a retired U.S. Army Special Forces lieutenant colonel who trained in Hong Kong and Beijing as a China Foreign Area Officer. He served on the Joint Staff, in the Defense Intelligence Agency, in United States Pacific Command and U.S. Army Pacific Command.

Babb has been teaching at the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth since 1991. He received his doctorate in history from the University of Kansas in 2012.
