In this third presentation for the 2018 academic year of the InterAgency Brown-Bag Lecture Series co-hosted by the U.S. Army Command and General Staff School and the Simons Center for Interagency Cooperation, FBI Intelligence Analyst Kenneth Hines will lead a discussion on homegrown violent extremists (HVEs) and the threats within the United States. Intelligence Analyst Kenneth Hines is assigned to the FBI Kansas City Field Office working various FBI investigative matters. He is a subject matter expert in domestic and homegrown terrorism and weapons of mass destruction investigations. Hines has more than 25 years strategic and tactical intelligence experience as both a retired U.S. Coast Guard officer and FBI intelligence analyst. Prior to joining the FBI, Hines was the chief bomb and arson investigator/bomb technician for a large county government agency in Missouri. Hines holds a bachelor's degree in communications from the University of Missouri at Columbia and an MBA from Lindenwood University. He is a graduate of the FBI Academy at Quantico and of the Naval War College. He has been awarded numerous awards for his service to our country to include a Presidential Unit Citation.
